

In response, UTI-Exton graduate Dylan Bansi, a Peterbilt technician who services diesel vehicles and engines, has prioritized over-the-road trucks that transport hospital equipment, medication, food, and key consumer goods.

"It feels good knowing you're following your passion while helping the world right now," Bansi



says. "We're not only standing behind the Peterbilt brand, but we're helping out the ones in need the most."


