The image of construction and other industries is evolving from diversity management to inclusion. Regardless of your industry, inclusion, minority

involvement, and diversity are critically important topics. Fifteen years ago, joining an organization that valued diversity was a consideration, but at that time the importance that was placed on the topic was certainly not what it is now. Past initiatives included specific participation

requirements on projects, but without a means of ensuring the success of the companies involved, the numbers were just that-empty stats. At the time, general contractors didn't have

the right structures or programs in place to make a meaningful impact. They found ways of meeting the established targets when required, but the real diversity was visibly lacking on jobsites. Times are changing. According to an article by

Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC): "There is a marked demographic shift in construction company ownership towards minorities and of businesses entering the construction industry will be minority- or female-owned." Today, organizations and owners who truly care about changing the makeup of the construction

industry are more sophisticated about how they request, monitor, and record diversity. Likewise, contractors today are more thoughtful about how we address and meet diversity targets.
